These awards are available only to professional artists resident in England, Wales or Scotland. Students are <u>not</u> eligible.

Copyright will be held by the artist but the BBC will retain the right to two transmissions within a two year period.

The Arts Council Film Sales Office will have the first option to sell the works to international television on a distribution fee basis.

Productions must be completed by mid-April 19972

The Arts Council may be able to assist in the negotiation of downtime in Paintbox, Harry, and other video production facilities.

Proposals will be considered by a selection group consisting of Alex Graham of The Late Show and David Curtis of the Arts Council Film, Video and Broadcasting Department, along with other appointed advisors.
