JEREMY WELSH

From October 24 to November 12, Jeremy Welsh will be undertaking a short residency at Wolverhampton Art Gallery to produce a new multimedia performance work, TALK-BOOK, commissioned by the West Midlands Performance Consortium.

Throughout the residency there will be continuous daily screening in the Gallery of a retrospective selection of Welsh's video tapes made between 1981 and 1987, accompanied by a display of documentation of previous projects.
