PROGRAMME 1: JIM SHEDDEN PRESENTS BRAKHAGE

"I cannot seriously imagine that there is a body of work of an individual in cinema more significant than Brakhage's. . . . If you want to know what cinema is, it's Brakhage" (P. Adams Sitney). Stan Brakhage has sustained a rich, restless and consistently creative career as a personal, experimental film artist, producing hundreds of works in many styles and formats since he began making films in the early Fifties. This intelligent and perceptive documentary describes the shape of Brakhage's life as filmmaker, husband, father and friend. As filmmaker Phil Solomon observes, Brakhage's way of making films has often changed with the circumstances of his life, biographical crises precipitating aesthetic crises. For the first time, Stan Brakhage has permitted his films to be excerpted for a documentary, allowing Toronto-based director Jim Shedden to show clearly the connections between Brakhage's life, work and aesthetic theories. BRAKHAGE contains sections from numerous important works by the artist, representing the many different periods of his filmmaking, including ANTICIPATION OF THE NIGHT, DOG STAR MAN, 23RD PSALM BRANCH, THE DANTE QUARTET, THE TEXT OF LIGHT, and "..." (SEASONS). For the novice, BRAKHAGE serves as an introduction to the work of one of this century's greatest artists; for those familiar with Brakhage's films, it is a wonderful summary of his life, art and influence.

Director Jim Shedden will be present to introduce the film.

British filmmaker, video artist and theorist Malcolm Le Grice is best known in North America for his challenging structural films of the Sixties and Seventies, his theoretical writings, and his brilliant and polemical book *Abstract Film and Beyond*. For more than a decade, however, Le Grice has worked primarily in video, producing a diverse body of work that integrates the concerns of his earlier films and writings with new electronic media in an aesthetic rooted in daily life and experience. This programme includes selections from *Sketches For A Sensual Philosophy*, a cycle of short videos commissioned for the BBC's Channel 4, and several other short works, including the stunning and absorbing recent pieces JOSEPH'S NEW COAT and EVEN A CYCLOPS PAYS THE FERRYMAN.
