Contortions sets out to debunk cliched portrayals of the unemployed. It follows the life of Peter who is young and unemployed but manages to maintain an albeit cynical, sense of hope and humour about his situation.

Two tongue-tied teenage girls outside a Cardiff job centre talk of their unemployment problems, then dry up under the unblinking gaze of the camera.

Cardiff film maker Mike Stubbs soon dispels notions that this may be just another worthy documentary. The third job centre interviewee, Pete, (played by Dane Gould) seems both shrewd and jaundiced and sends up his former jobs, in a bottle factory and as a shelf-stacker, by treating us to an almost interminable (ultimately very amusing) recital of his prosaic tasks.

There is a deep cynicism underlying Stubbs's overtly playful 40-minute work, which focuses on Pete's abortive efforts to land a job, his fantasies and attempts to appease his girlfriend. Along the way, Stubbs disconcertingly and deliberately disrupts straightforward narrative to deliver bitter broadsides against smug theorists and the mediamen, who study the unemployed working classes almost as another branch of anthropology.
