

With the increase in the use of video in live art works, the West Glamorgan Video and Film Workshop has organised a week of the latest in Video/Performance Art.

There will be a selection of single screen works and a series of talks and performances by visiting artists.

The backbone of the week will be a Multi-monitor video installation called "The Great Divide" by Scottish artists Pictorial Heroes. This will run throughout the week in Room 2 of the Glynn Vivian with an introductory talk by the artists at 7.00pm. on Monday 19th October.

Richard Layzell will perform twice on Wednesday 21st., the first performance called "Words" will start at 1.00pm. lunchtime in the Glyn Vivian with a special performance called "The Blue Fingers" at the Fringe Club in Ty Tawe, Christina Street at 8.00pm.

To end the week, Bridget Wishart will sound out the Glyn Vivian with images and a great deal of noise in four short performances throughout Friday, especially devised for the occasion.

In a world where people often only desire us for our money, even just our votes, it's refreshing to discover somebody who wants more - our minds and our money. That individual is (for the sake of a phrase that describes his engaging, comic and virtuoso brand of Mime, movement and monologue) performance artist Richard Layzell. Once a sculptor at the Slade School of Art, Richard forsook the graven image around 1974 in favour of using the entire person himself - as the art object. Back then, such activity was reckoned to be a good way of bashing the art market. And the class of '74 had a point. Richard still hasn't sold his body. Nor has he exactly categorised what he does: "I'm floored when people ask me what it is - I just don't know what to say. I just want people to come and see what I do." CITY LIMITS.
