

Channel 5, A Showcase for Video is a project organised by London Video Arts in association with the ICA and DER TV and Video Ltd. The series of events coincides with the screening on Channel 4 TV's Eleventh Hour, of a series of three programmes on independent video, to be transmitted on September 16, 23 and 30. This will be the first major showing on British Television of independently produced video Art, while Channel 5 is aimed at bringing a wide range of recent British video to the London public through a range of venues, some of which have not previously exhibited work of this kind.
