INTERACTIVE VIDEO

BIT 32 Liverpool are installing a 'Knowledge Navigator' at both the Bluecoat and the Tate. This is an interactive information project, commissioned by the Festival for £200. A similar project which took place at Milton Keynes last year cost the organiser's £20k! Martin Wright, a senior producer at the BBC Open University, will also be providing interactive Video for the Media Education event, 'Splitting Images' (See Education), which will take place during the Festival.

NOTES AND FURTHER INFORMATION ON THE FESTIVAL SCREENING PROGRAMME.

The screening programme will take place in the Bluecoat performance space, except when particular programmes require a more appropriate venue. Our first choice for the screenings was Unity. However, the venue will be undergoing considerable refurbishment at the time. The Bluecoat was felt to be the next best option.
