In 1985 Ian Bourn founded the HOUSEWATCH artists collective, who created numerous film/video installation events shown in Britain and Japan between 1985 and 1997.

HOUSEWATCH designed works for architecture and urban environments, from the purpose-built Japanese tea house of *Paperhouse* (1992) to *Imaginary Opera* (1994), which used the exterior of the Royal Festival Hall, forty film projectors and a live orchestra.

His video-installation *The Kiss*, a collaboration with filmmaker John Smith, is his first work specifically designed for a gallery space and has been shown in Tokyo 1999 and Turin 2003.

Since the late seventies Bourn has also made a series of distinctive experimental video narratives which have been shown in major international film/video festivals, art shows and on TV.

His recent Channel Four commision *Black White & Green* (2003) was a meditation on the aesthetics of the traditional London dish of pie and mash, using a mix of live-action and computer/generated imagery to create another world, within the plate and beneath the pie crust.
