Erth, 1971. 25 mins, sound and colour, Ekta 16 mm. Shows still photos of the Earth taken from space and the air, plus 3 minutes of film of high-speed scanning of pages from a volume of the *Encyclopedia Britannica*. Mostly black and silent: intermittent images and verbal comments in German.

Dadarama videos, 6 x 6 mins, made for Channel 4 Television's Dadarama series, 1984, transmitted in 1985. Umatic/VHS. Produced for Channel 4 by Anna Ridley of Annalogue Ltd, London: John O'Groats to Cape Wrath; Cumbrae Clyde; The Gulf; Road's One; Dave's Bike; Nmutter. Black and white aerial photos of the Earth and of an Arab with coloured, target-like images superimposed, except for Nmutter which is completely abstract, brightly coloured, concentric circle imagery.
