

STEPHEN PARTRIDGE

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Stephen Partridge is known firstly as a "video artist", whose work has been exhibited widely and includes the Tate gallery, The Kitchen in New York, and The Paris Biennalle. He has also curated a number of influential video shows *Video Art 78, UK TV, National Review of Live Art 1988-90, 19:4:90 Television Interventions,* and touring tape packages *Made in Scotland I,II, III.* He has been working creatively with videotape since 1974 and has developed an increasing knowledge of the manipulative possibilities of the medium with regard to visual language and expression, both on technologically "simple" levels, and with regard to more complex "state of the art" posts production systems.

Stephen is a Director of Fields and Frames Productions Ltd, and as well as making his own work for Television (works in the innovative Channel 4 projects Dadarama and Television Interventions) he co-produced a short series of student and artists work *Not Necessarily* with BBC Scotland for BBC2 network television in 1991.

He has lectured for a fifteen years in a number of British and European art colleges, and is presently Course Director and Senior Lecturer in charge of production at Europe's premier college for video and animation: the School of Television & Electronic Imaging, Duncan of Jordanstone College of Art, Dundee, Scotland. Here he has established the Television Workshop, a production agency for artists wishing to produce work in video, television, animation, computer graphics, and installation work, with access to the School's excellent facilities which he designed to be among the best in Europe.
