DADARAMA & IAN BREAKWELL'S DIARIES

Artists' works for Channel 4 Television
Produced by Anna Ridley with work by Ian Breakwell, Rosemary Butcher,
David Cunningham, Rose Garrard, John Latham, Stephen Partridge, Paul Richards &
Michael Nyman

The two series *DADARAMA* and *IAN BREAKWELL'S DIARIES*, broadcast by Channel 4 Television in 1984 and 1985, represent a unique collaboration between artists, producer and television company. The projects were initiated and realised by **Anna Ridley**, whose long experience of programme making and working with artists made for a special rapport, which resulted in the works matching the original conception as closely as possible.

A number of important conditions were negotiated and accepted by Channel 4's commissioning editor Paul Madden, which helped further in this respect.

Anna Ridley had tried for nearly a decade to bring this idea to fruition: it took the advent of Channel 4 to make this possible, and it is hoped that a regular place will be established for this kind of work on television, including the new Arts Channel's satellite and cable station.

The Exhibition includes **Rose Garrard's** *TUMBLED FRAME*, a mixed media installation with video. Existing role models (the Madonna and the anonymous artist's model) become two polarities of a spiral, negative in the restrictiveness of the frames but positive in its power to move through them.
