The subject matter of my work is largely autobiographical, with characters construed from friends and people I've met. The settings are also familiar to me, in particular the corner of East London where

LENNY'S DOCUMENTARY takes the form of a monologue. It involves one character who thinks aloud the script for a planned or imagined documentary about his life and environment. Lenny is obsessed by a bleak vision of his past and present circumstances. We are given fragments of what seems an eternal evening of dark introspection. A glimmer of hope remains in the tape's one visual metaphor Leytonstone High Road, which acts as a release from the dark interior and a possible way out for Lenny.



THE END OF THE WORLD: "I remember a man watching a current affairs programme and arguing with his television. He got so worked up about some war in another country that, in his rage, he spilt a cup of hot tea all down his trousers. His wife quietly cursed, seeing the tea she'd bothered to make go to waste." It is usually pre-scripted either as dialogue or storyboard. The use of film or video depends, respectively, on whether visual imagery or spoken word are the main carriers of the narrative - on factors such as duration, allowance for improvisation and picture definition.
