ENon-Violence in Action (Joram ten Brink & Jini Rawlings, Concord, 50 mina) This two-part tape weaves, together the experiences of these who are attempting to dismantle situations of political conflict through passive resistance. The range here is wide, from the Zamani Soweto Sisters Council who sew patchworks to illustrate their suppressed histories through to the workshops at Corrymeela, Belfast where Protestants and Catholics meet to tackle the roots of their prejudices. In each case the emphasis is on the ability to convert anger into a constructive force and the belief in the personal responsibility for change. Supplemented by archive footage providing instances from the past, the tape puts non-violent action into both a world and historical perspective. EMahalia (dir Allen Miner, Hendring, 72 mins, £9.99) A portrait of Mahalia Jackson filmed shortly before her death, recording her on a European tour of concert appearances, enthralling audiences everywhere with her rich and powerful voice. Against a backdrop of her songs, we also catch a more personal side a with additional commentary from Mahalia herself, the camera follows her between performances, travelling and rehearsing, or taking time off to sight see, try on hats, even a visit to the dentist. Sparing herself nothing to reach out to God's children, we're made painful witness to her back-stage exhaustion and the dedication which drove her. Despite idiosyncratic editing, the tape manages to capture not only the exhilaration of her performances but also her personal warmth and sincerity in a powerful and moving tribute to the world's greatest gospel singer.

To complement this Hendring have also re-released Gospel Joy (58 mins, £9.99) recorded at Riverside Studies, 1985 gospel festival, featuring an impressive line-up of home grown singers,
