Alan Robertson and Doug Aubrey began working together in 1985, having both left Maidstone College of Art in Kent. They share an interest in performance based video work and moved to Glasgow to avoid what they have described as 'the self-perpetuating mediocrity of the London video art scene.'

As well as establishing a reputation for agitational and strongly experimental video pieces, during the 'eighties they were influential in establishing large scale video installation works across Scotland.

In 1988, after several years of making short works, they began production of **Work**, **Rest and Play**. Without public finance, they have now completed three of the five episodes.

Alan Robertson and Doug Aubrey both work freelance in the television industry, Robertson as a producer and video tape editor and Aubrey as a writer and director.
