A NEW CAR AND TWO WEEKS IN MALAGA

Consett has become famous for unemployment since the steelworks closed, but now that the redundancy spending spree has ended what comes next? The government and the MSC say education, but in Consett there are many who criticise the commitment of the authorities and the usefulness of their conventional educational programmes. The first part of this video concentrates on the work of Consett Photo-Archive, Derwentside Unemployed Group and an unemployed music project. Unemployed people are informing themselves with a view to intervening in the crisis of de-industrialisation. The second part is a record of a conference in Newcastle where these issues were discussed.

GB 1985 Col 16mm 90 Mins Combining rare '40s newsreel footage with interview and fiction, Unstable Elements shows how Britain came to build the bomb and how the bomb was sold to the public. Part One interviews leading comtemporary nuclear scientists, including Dr. Roberts, Director of Harwell and Dr. Ross Hesketh who worked at Windscale prior to his 'leak' enforced resignation, Part Two's fictional 'sanctuary' dramatises the dilemmas. power trips and emotional disintergration of a Sizewell scientist whose nuclear family is as explosive as the product he handles.[tb]Unstable Elements[tn]charts the erosion of democracy and the quest for power 'complicit with this culture', - Edinburgh Film Festival.
