About our work in general

We have repeatedly been exploring particular themes, via the media of video, film and photography. These themes, drawn from everyday life, relate to the perceptions of time and/or space and memory.

The approach and realisation procedures (ways of working) have an interwoven and fundamental influence on our work. We are working towards the presentation of a stimulus (in video and photographs) which relates to the viewer's past/future experience of the subject. This interaction between the stimulus and the viewer/participator becomes, at its best, an event. Using 'Journeys' as an example: part of the material being shown here to the public is itself the result of some reactions to our basic material.
